



The Passive Spectator exhibition is an extension of a previous, ongoing series of works entitled Dream Diaries (2011 — present). This development, which includes works made since the beginning of 2019, consists of a series of artist's books and related works that reflect the artist's revisiting of subconscious experiences, of personal trauma, memory, dreams and errant thoughts.

Visually, the works consist of fragmented text, remembered imagery and intuitive mark making. While the resultant imagery often deliberately seems ambiguous, there are many clues that allow the viewer to reflect on their own unique but related experiences.

Overall, the imagery of *The Passive Spectator* is a record of a variety of expected and unexpected experiences. Through the artist's intuitive reflection and interpretation, we are led to a convoluted range of experiences. The outcome is mirrored in the human tendency to forget or conflate dream sequences or other subconscious information, rendering them as fragments or mere traces of initial occurrences.





ABOUT THE ARTIST BY STEPHEN SPURRIER

Rhi Johnson's sense of adventure, combined with her natural curiosity, has allowed her to evolve as a wise individual and as a unique artist. The range of her study, from a degree, to honours, and subsequently a PhD has fed her interest in developing a range of technical skills together with a philosophical approach to all of her activities.

Rhi is able to work across a range of media; in this instance, works on canvas and artist's books. Her skills in both media have developed effectively since her early student days and continue to grow as is evidenced in this exhibition.

Her recent lecturing at USQ, and her ongoing conducting of local workshops in the medium of artist's books, has led to some excellent outcomes for students and participants. Her teaching is not just process — Rhi has a philosophical approach to education, encouraging experimentation and innovation in her students while concurrently recognising each person's unique qualities. Her mild temperament and bright wit are important aspects of this process.

As well as this, she is a great survivor, and contributor as a mother and family member, who is able to balance this with her career as both artist and educator. Rhi is highly respected for her courage and commitment.


