Following your Conference presentation and subject to peer review, your paper may also be considered for publication in the Journal of the Society for Sustainability and Environmental Engineering, or recommended for consideration in select international journals (eg. SSEE Journal of Environmental Engineering, etc.).

All abstracts will be reviewed. The primary basis upon which decisions to accept or reject abstracts and proposed papers will be the direct relevance to conference themes and objectives. Fundamentally, all abstracts and papers will need to demonstrate their relevance to sustainability within engineering. Based on conference timing and total numbers of presentations available, such as the number of parallel sessions, final abstracts and papers will be accepted and allocated between extended abstracts, non-reviewed papers and peer-reviewed papers.

From the abstract, three types of papers will be accepted for the conference:

Extended Abstracts –	Maximum 4 pages. Reviewed by Technical Committee only.
Full Papers –	Not peer reviewed – maximum 10 pages.
	Papers may be allocated an oral presentation.
Full Papers –	Full blind peer review – maximum 10 pages.
	Papers will be allocated an oral presentation.

Please submit your 300 word abstract using the Conference Proforma, including the type of paper proposed, by no later than Wednesday 18th February 2009.
