



The Space Between Us is a major midcareer survey of the past two decades of Lincoln Austin's practice bringing together more than 60 sculptures and works on paper from public and private collections. The exhibition reveals Austin's abiding delight in pattern and perception and an artistic practice driven by his feeling for materials, his interest in perception and optical effects, and his desire to activate space.
