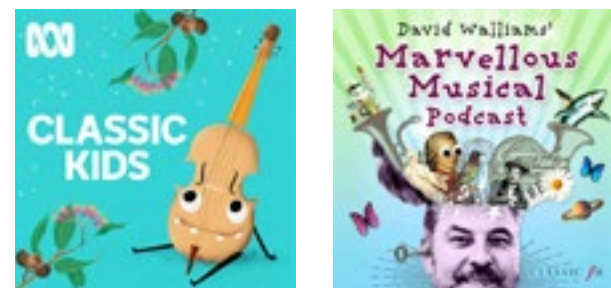

Encouraging a love of music with your child

Listen to a wide variety of music

There is a whole world of wonderful orchestral music to listen to. Be open to music from different countries, eras of time and traditions. Recent studies have demonstrated that people who access a wide and varied range of music and cultural activities regularly are more tolerant and creative thinking.

Songs and rhymes

Singing can fit into almost every part of the day and the more repetition the better! These small activities, especially those with actions help to ready the brain for learning, develop linguistic skills, promote coordination and memory skills

Invite curiosity about sound

Ask questions about where the direction of sound and music is coming from? How loud or soft is it? What might make that sound? Simple questions like these built into everyday routines help to build aural (hearing) awareness.

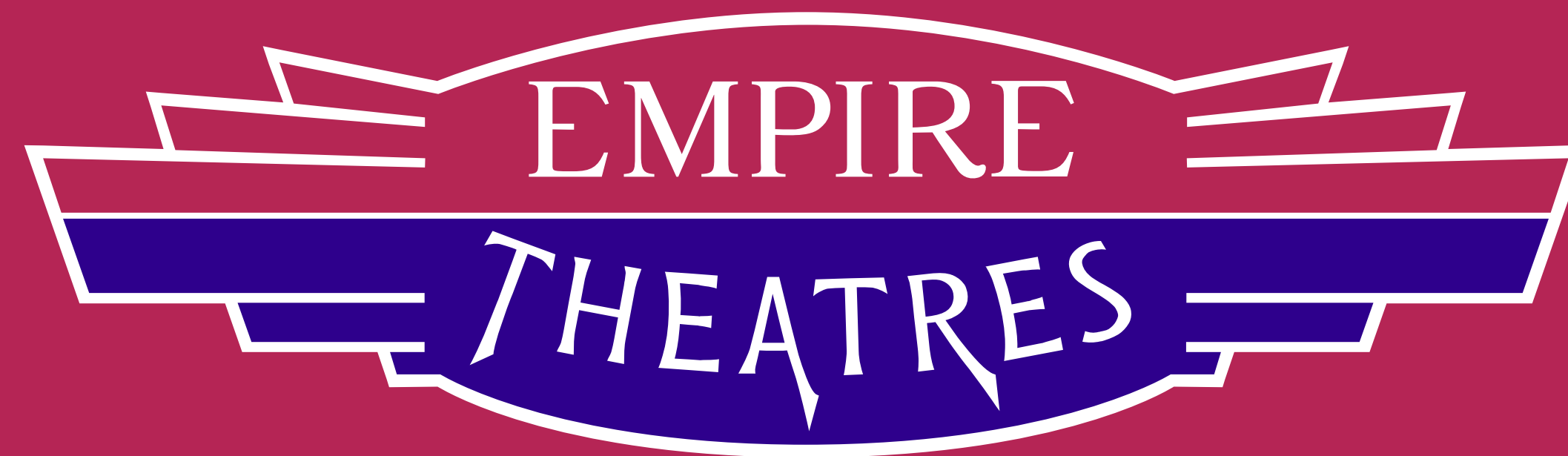
